FROM FRED'S HEART

My life personally and the whole organization of H.I.M. is changing, which is normal and natural. Praise the Lord! I'm still glad I'm saved and **excited about our Lord Jesus – Himself — being Author and Finisher of our faith!** To deny the complexity and mystery of Biblical and spiritual life is foolish. We daily die to self and take up our cross and follow Him (Luke 14:25-34)! Are you following — daily — the heart of God?? *Serious question.*

Body life, team work, etc. — we all hear about these concepts and often talk about them; yet, in the middle of life *adjustments*, like we are now facing, we can be selfish, insecure, jealous, or confused. We must remember...



But in fact God has arranged the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has combined the members of the body and has given greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it. (1 Cor. 12:18-26)

Barb and I have faced such tremendous heartaches, battles, attacks, misunderstandings, indifferences, hurts and weird sufferings "from the world, the flesh and the devil". During these 37+ years of ministry, I have often pondered Paul's words in 2 Tim. 4:1-22...they are worth re-reading and considering in these days of deception, distractions and delusions. God's Word is **timeless** and **living** for each of our hearts today if we take the time to **LISTEN!**

From the Pastor's Heart

What ever happened to the Church that was? What has happened to the Church that is? Today we are encouraged to attend the “church” of our choice, as if the Church of Jesus Christ (not a denomination) is somewhere to go. I find it a bit strange that the early Church which grew to about 10,000 in a matter of days did not go looking for property on which to build a “plant”. In the New Testament, the Church was recognized as the Body of Christ of which He is the head and true believers are gifted members of that body (Acts 2:42-47). So, they didn’t go to “Church”, they were the Church, and they met daily from house to house, eating their meat with gladness and singleness of heart. But that changed! The home was no longer a haven of holiness or a garden of godliness for saints to gather. The world changed and so did the Church. The Church changed from a living organism to a luxurious place to occupy. It changed from going into all the world to inviting the world to “come to church”. **It changed from a body to a building, from building men to building monuments, and from going into the world to preach the gospel to bringing the world into the “church” to hear the gospel.** So the world changed the “church” rather than the Church changing the world. Maybe that is why the “church” today is more “institutional” than “inspirational” and “instructive”. **When we get back to “being” the Church that was — rather than attending the “church” that is — perhaps we shall once again see GOD do something for man rather than seeing what man can do for God.**
